The Department of Natural Resources promises, in consideration of the promises made by the Applicant herein, to obligate to the Applicant the amount of money referred to above, and to tender to the Applicant that portion of the obligation which is required to pay the Department's share of the costs of the above project stage, based upon the above percentage of assistance. The Applicant hereby promises, in consideration of the promises made by the Department herein, to execute the project described above in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

The following special project terms and conditions were added to this Agreement before it was signed by the parties hereto:

Based on the Georgia historic Preservation Office, the following conditions must be met before work may begin on the site.

1. Before beginning construction/ground disturbing activities, conduct a Phase I archaeological survey for all areas of ground-disturbing activity located within the project site but outside the known boundaries of site 9JK317, including any equipment staging areas, or newly constructed roadways that may be required to access the project area, excluding the areas specified in Condition 3, as applicable. The archaeological investigations should be conducted by a professional archaeologist that meets SOI professional qualification standards and the survey methods should closely follow the Georgia Council of Professional Archaeologists' recommended survey standards. Provide HPD with the Phase I survey report for review and comment, when available.

2. Avoid the use of heavy machinery (e.g., bulldozer, tractor, skid steer, and similar) and avoid staging equipment or materials within the known boundaries of site 9JK317 or utilize appropriate matting, where necessary.

3. A professional meeting the applicable SOI Professional Qualifications Standards for Archaeology must be present on site to conduct controlled excavations (i.e., dig and monitor the holes for each footing and post) of all areas of ground disturbance related to the installation of the 12" diameter cement piers associated with the elevated walkway and the posts associated with the horizontal cable fencing. The SOI-qualified archaeologist should also monitor ground disturbing activities associated with the construction of the natural walking trails within the immediate vicinity of the stone features and the elevated walkway. A monitoring report that conforms to the most current version of the SOI Standards and Guidelines for Archaeological Documentation, as well as the Georgia Council for Professional Archaeologist's Standards and Guidelines for Archaeological Investigations (2019), should be provided to HPD for review and comment, when available.

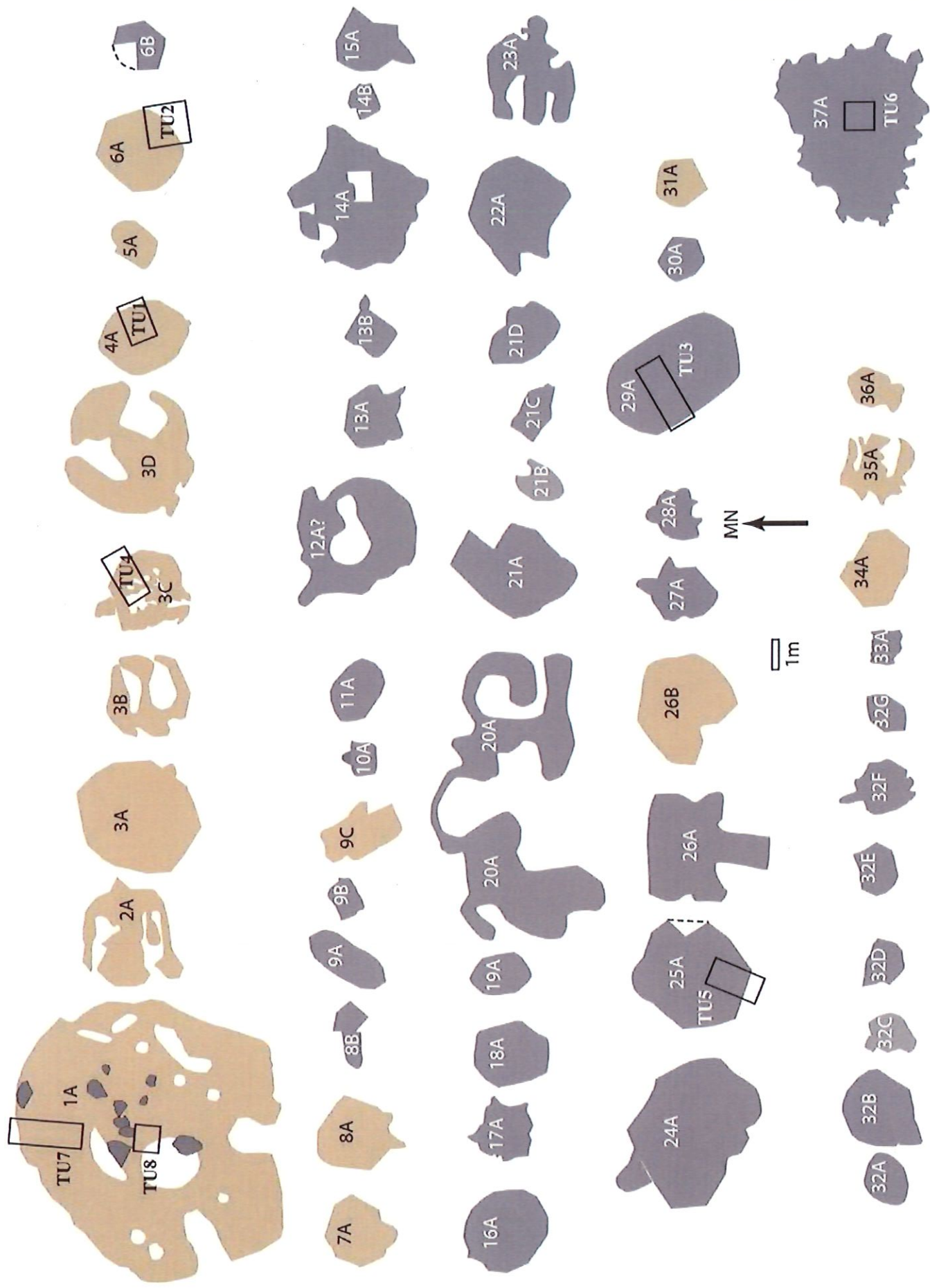


Figure 8. Traced Outlines of Piled Stone Features from Sites 9Jk317 (RP01A-RP36A) and 9Jk59 (RP37A).
